## Un-cancelled appointments - everyone else has to wait longer

When you miss an appointment without telling us we have no opportunity to fit **another patient** into the empty slot - it's also costly as staff still have to be paid.

For example, in the last quarter, 110 patients failed to cancel a doctor's appointment (many even though they had had a text reminder) this is equivalent to almost 4 days'

worth of doctor's appointments; similarly, 146 patients failed to cancel a nurses' appointment equivalent to 5 days' worth of appointments.

#### Sugar



Your children might seem fine on the outside, but too much sugar can cause tooth decay and lead to the build-up of harmful fat on the inside that you can't see. Fat around vital organs can cause serious disease in the future, e.g. weight gain, type 2 diabetes, heart disease, -some cancers.

#### Diabetes - are you at risk of Diabetes?

It is an increasing and serious problem and action needs to be taken now. If you have been advised that you are at risk (have impaired glucose regulators) make sure that you have a copy of a new guide 'Are you are risk of diabetes' (pick one up from SAMC). It is packed with practical advice of the steps you can take to avoid this condition. SAMC will be monitoring your condition with annual monitoring checks including a non-fasting blood test.

#### Dementia

Dementia is an umbrella term for various forms of neurological impairment which affect memory and create difficulties in thinking. It is progressive. It can affect both men and women: women are more likely to develop **Alzheimer's**, whilst men tend to develop **Vascular dementia**.

You can reduce your risk of dementia by not smoking, maintaining a healthy diet, taking regular exercise, reducing alcohol intake, and keeping socially active, with your brain active with puzzles/quizzes/reading etc.

## New triage Appointments system working well

If you haven't been in lately you won't be aware that we've changed our 'on the day' appointments process by introducing a 'triage' system' (a process of determining the priority of patients' treatment based on the severity of their condition).

### How a day at the surgery now works:

- if you phone or visit after all the available slots have been taken your request will be logged by the reception team onto our **'triage list'** managed by the day's **duty doctor**.
- you will be asked to **remain by your phone** to await the call
- the **duty doctor** will make a maximum of 2 calls to you but not call again if you don't respond; in such a case you will need to call the surgery again if you still need to
- the duty doctor will phone you as soon as possible to agree the appropriate course of action
  - o in certain cases, at triage assessment on the phone, the **duty doctor** may decide to arrange a home call
  - o this may be resolvable without a need for a same-day visit by you to the surgery, but if it is, an appointment will be offered to you or booked for a subsequent day

## Sign up for online services and save time phoning or waiting at the medical centre
